ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

- I. The name of this corporation is The Praxis Group.
- II. This corporation is a nonprofit public benefit corporation and is not organize for the private gain of any person. It is organized under the Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation Law for charitable purposes. The specific purposes for which this corporation is organized are:
 - To promote cultural activism as an important force in community development and as a viable alternative to political activism;
 - To stimulate community culture and encourage community-based problem-solving by applying innovative ideas in practical ways through locally sponsored programs, projects, events, activities, and publications;
 - To serve community-based organizations as a research and resource center for organizational know-how and know-where;
 - To provide organizational development assistance to communitybased organizations.

- IV. (a) This corporation is organized and operated exclusively for educational, scientific and charitable purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.
- (b) Notwithstanding any other provision of these Articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (1) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code or (2) by a corporation contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code.
- (c) No substantial part of the activities of this corporation shall consist of carrying on propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate or intervene in any political campaign (including the publishing or distribution of statements) on behalf of, or in opposition to, any candidate for public office.

VI. The property of this corporation is irrevocably dedicated to educational, scientific, and charitable purposes and no part of the net income or assets of the organization shall ever inure to the benefit of any director, officer or member thereof or to the benefit of any private person.

On the dissolution of winding up of the corporation, its assets remaining after payment of, or provision for payment of, all debts and liabilities of this corporation, shall be distributed to a nonprofit fund, foundation, or corporation which is organized and operated exclusively for educational, scientific, and charitable purposes and which has established its tax-exempt status under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.
